We had a meeting with the city and their consultants (AECOM) on the morning of October 6, regarding the pond and the decreased water level. There will be three (3) test holes drilled and inspection wells to monitor the water flow underground. We would ask that ALL members stay away from the equipment and the field personnel while the drilling procedure is taking place. Once they have these monitoring wells in place, they will be recording the underground water flow information. This will assist AECOM in making the required recommendations that will allow the City to remediate the problem that was caused, affecting our pond water level. Thank you, everyone in advance for being diligent to keep clear of their work site and allowing them to do their work in a timely and safe manner. Once there is more information available, it will be shared with the membership.



## **HMCS** Weyburn




22 February 1943,

HMCS Weyburn struck a mine, which ripped open the portside, splitting the funnel from bottom to top and buckling the decks. After the initial explosion, all firing pins from the depth charges were safely removed except for two, which had jammed. Into the rescue operation, something gave way inside Weyburn and the ship sank. As the ship sank the two depth charges whose pins had not been removed exploded, killing those in the water and killing and severely injuring members of the rescue ship.



#### **Membership**

The summer is coming to an end, the clocks go back and we start the busiest time of the year for membership.

The 2026 membership cards are now available from the bar or at the next three General Meetings.

We currently have 925 membership cards to process, and about <u>300 members still need to get their meeting in</u>, sign the attendance book, and get their 2025 membership card stamped all before the end of January 2026.

Just a reminder that all members residing in Oxford County must attend at least one General Meeting each year to maintain their membership status. Members unable to attend a meeting must contact me, and I can add a notation to the book in place of attendance.

As advised in the September General Meeting, the club has had to increase prices across the board. Starting with the 2026 memberships, a regular membership will now be \$90.00, with the senior membership increasing to \$50.00. This year, a senior membership is classified as any member whose date of birth is in or before February 1961. Memberships can be paid by cash, debit, credit cards and a large number of members are now using e-transfer for payments.

The membership records are now 100% fully integrated into the Clover computer system, and it is imperative and is the responsibility of any member paying their dues, to ensure that a record is made of the transaction, whether at the bar or in the office. This ensures that the membership computer records are kept accurate and up to date and reduces the possibility of membership errors going forward.

Most importantly, with the club membership almost at capacity and a significant number of members on the waiting list, this year we will adhere strictly to the January 2026 deadline for membership renewals, with no exceptions. After January 31, 2026, any members who have not attended at least one 2025 General Meeting, have their 2025 membership card stamped, signed the attendance book and purchased their 2026 membership will no longer be classified as members. Their membership numbers will be re-allocated, and they will lose access to the club even as a guest!.

On a more positive note, members paying their 2026 membership dues on or before 31 December will have their number entered in a draw with a chance to win a free membership.







#### **Private Bookings of the Club**

# Quick & Easy 7 Minute Bean & Spinach Soup



- 3 cups vegetable broth
- 1/2 cup mini vermicelli noodles\*\*
- 1/2 cup canned white beans\*\* drained and rinsed
- 1 cup fresh baby spinach packed
- 1/2 cup diced celery
- 1 tsp finely minced garlic
- 1/2 yellow onion diced
- pepper, salt.to taste
- ½ cup fresh parsley(optional)



- 1. In a medium-sized pot, bring the broth to a boil on high heat.
- 2. Add in the noodles and cook for 5 minutes (or adjust the time to the noodle you are using just take 3 minutes off the recommended cooking time.)
- 3. Add in the beans, onion, celery and garlic. Boil for another 3 minutes or until the noodles are tender.
- 4. Remove the pot from the heat, stir in the spinach, and cover the pot until the spinach is wilted. Add in any seasoning as you see fit.
- 5. Serve warm!

\*\*If you can't find mini vermicelli noodles, break up regular vermicelli or spaghetti noodles into 1-inch pieces. Or, use your favorite noodle. The cooking time depends on the noodle though! Vermicelli cooks quickly.
