HMCS Chedabucto






On 31 October 1943, *Chedabucto* was sailing down the Saint Lawrence River when the minesweeper collided with the cable ship *Lord Kelvin*



to ensure your Membership or be expelled for a period of not less than one year.

All Association privileges will cease for that year and such person shall not be allowed to attend any functions sponsored by the Association in the clubrooms or be in the clubrooms as a guest. Should such a person desire to be reinstated, an application for reinstatement is required and it shall be subject to the same qualification as if he had never been a member.

Membership

This will be the last report for the 2025 year club calendar and I look forward to another busy year for the membership chair. The membership year ends on 31 January each year. As in previous years, we have now held back all the new member applications received, and these have all been added to a waiting list and are being held until the Executive meeting in February 2026. At the end of January 2026, we will know how many new members we can bring on board, given our cap of 950 members in the club. Priority is given to Navy, Associate, Affiliate and Social applications in that order. In 2025 we restricted the new member applications to 10 each month. This proved to be a more manageable number for all involved and will be continued going forward into 2026.

As we work to clean up the membership list at year end and prepare the new sign in book ready for the February 2026 General meeting, I would ask that if you know of any members that are unable to attend a General Meeting through illness, mobility, work schedules, move out of tow etc. to please let me know and I can mark the book accordingly to maintain their membership status.

In past years, the club has been somewhat lenient on late payment of membership dues but given our high membership numbers, the cut-off date for the payment of 2026 membership dues is fixed at January 31, 2026, with no exceptions. After this date, the membership numbers for non paying delinquent members will be reassigned and members will lose their club membership and be subject to the 12-month suspension. If you know of any members that are unable to pay their membership dues through illness, out of the country etc. to please let the club know and we will work with them to avoid losing their membership.

Current membership is now at 937 members, and the waiting list is now at 64 with the majority of the applications being for Social membership.





Christmas Crack

28 to 35 saltine crackers (about one sleeve, enough to line your tray)

1 cup (220g) firmly packed brown sugar

1 cup (225g or 2 sticks) butter

2 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips



Line a sheet pan with foil and coat with cooking spray or alternatively, you can use a nonstick silicone baking mat.

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees.

Place the crackers in a single layer on the baking sheet.

Place the butter and brown sugar in a medium saucepan, bring to a boil. Boil for 3 minutes.

Pour the brown sugar mixture over the crackers and spread with a spatula to coat.

Place the sheet pan in the oven and bake for 3-5 minutes, or until bubbling.

Remove the pan from the oven and immediately scatter the chocolate chips over the top. Place the pan back in the oven for another 2-3 minutes to melt the chocolate. Spread the chocolate evenly over the top.

Place the sprinkles, nuts, or Christmas candy on top of the chocolate. Or leave plain!

Let the toffee sit until completely cool, either at room temperature or you can refrigerate. Break into pieces.
