HMCS Raccoon



September 6th, 1942

HMCS Raccoon was escorting a merchant ship when it was attacked and sunk. The captain of the lead escort observed the Raccoon zigzagging in search of the submarine. Two explosions were heard, which the other ships believed were depth charges from the Raccoon. It was only later that it was established that the explosions were the sound of Raccoon's boiler exploding after being hit by a torpedo.

37 crew went down with the ship.

We must never forget their sacrifice.

Note:

The Battle of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, which saw German U-boats penetrate the Cabot Strait and the Strait of Belle Isle to sink 23 ships between 1942 and 1944, marked the only time since the War of 1812 that enemy warships inflicted death within Canada's inland waters. The battle advanced to within 300 kilometers of Québec City. A war that pervaded people's lives but was still somehow remote, had become immediate, threatening, and very real. The Battle of the Gulf of St. Lawrence was part of a larger conflict called The Battle of the Atlantic which included all of the Atlantic Ocean between North America and Europe and was fought between 1939 and 1945.

Membership



February 1st is the start of the 2026 membership year and marks the busiest month of the year for the Membership chair. January 31st is the closure of the membership books for the past year and as happens each year end, we do expect to lose some members.

Our current total membership numbers stand at 944 members, but I am anticipating our numbers to drop this year by 50 to 100 members, that have decided for whatever reason, not to renew their membership. If our total membership drops below 900 members, this will allow us to bring on board more new members currently on the waiting list.

Over 700 members have already paid for their 2026 memberships which is great. In early February I will be able to report on the final total membership and numbers by membership category. Another plus this year is the status of the sign in book where, to date, just over 880 members have already signed in for attending their General Meeting.

In the last year the membership applications slowed down considerably, and we now have the waiting list, giving Membership a much better control over all the applications. The waiting list now stands at 84 applications with over 60 of that number being for social member status. A big thank you goes here to all the members that have contacted me through the year about not being able to attend their one General Meeting and more importantly, they have been giving me names of members that were unable to attend a General Meeting through illness, mobility, work schedules etc. and I was able to mark the sign in book accordingly.

I look forward to seeing all the members again in 2026.

butter for greasing pan
1 tablespoon butter
1 medium onion diced
2 lbs hash browns frozen, diced (not shredded)
1/2 cup butter melted
21.5 ounces condensed cream of chicken soup (two 10.75 ounce cans)
2 cups sour cream
salt to taste
black pepper to taste
2 cups cheddar cheese freshly grated
3 cups corn flakes crushed
2 tablespoons butter



Preheat oven to 350° F. Prepare a 9×13 casserole dish by greasing with butter or nonstick spray.

Sauté onion in 1 tablespoon butter until translucent in a medium skillet. In a large bowl, add frozen hash browns, melted butter, cream of chicken soup, sour cream, grated cheese, cooked onion, salt, and black pepper. Mix together until combined.

Replace medium skillet to the heat and melt the remaining 4 tablespoons butter. Add in crushed corn flakes and stir to toast about 1 minute. Sprinkle over top casserole.

Bake uncovered for 40-45 minutes or until hot and bubbly. Serve hot.
