## **HMCS** Alberni



#### 21, August 1944

*Alberni* was torpedoed and sunk by <u>*U-480*</u>, in the <u>English Channel</u>. 59 crew were lost after the torpedo struck the warship on her port side immediately aft of the engine room, causing her to sink in less than a minute.

## 

At 11:45 on August 21 she was steaming south at fourteen knots in fair weather. "Hands to Dinner" had just been piped. Four minutes later, with no sonar warning whatsoever, she was hit by a torpedo fired from U-480 on her port side just aft of the engine room. In less than 10 seconds she was awash from the funnel aft, listing to port and sinking fast. In another twenty seconds she was gone, sinking stern first. Most of the off-watch hands were trapped in their mess decks, and only one stoker escaped from the engine and boiler rooms.

There was not even time to release Carley floats, and men, many without time to put on life belts as the ship foundered had to cling to odd pieces of debris.

Lt. Frank. Williams was awarded the Royal Humane Society's bronze medal for his work in saving members of the crew.

31 crew members were rescued by Royal Navy motor torpedo boats (MTB)

## Private Bookings of the Club

## **Members ONLY**

**O.C.N.V.A. members** must fill out a "Special Occasion Request for Use of Facilities" form describing the event. The forms are available from the office or a bartender on duty.

You must pay a set donation for the use of the club, payable at the time of booking.

# If it is approved, as an O.C.N.V.A. Member, you <u>MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE</u> for the duration (start time to finish) and assume responsibility for all guests.

#### • No outside Caterers allowed.

- Food order from the galley a 50% \$ deposit is required at the time of booking.
- Entertainment: You are financially responsible for any entertainment you wish to hire
- Any person under suspension from Club privileges MAY NOT enter the premises or be signed in as a guest for special occasions.
- Decorations are permitted ABSOLUTELY NO CONFETTI, RICE OR POPCORN OR SPARKLED DECORATIONS THAT MAY RESULT IN EXTRA CLEANING, OF ANY KIND.
  - Failure to remove <u>ALL</u> of your decorations will result in a \$100.00 clean up fee.

## *No political, social causes or advertisement signage is permitted on the grounds or in the OCNVA.*

<u>Custodial Wages</u>; Galley, Club rooms, and utilized areas MUST be cleaned properly after your event plus <u>ALL</u> tables & chairs are to be returned to their original locations. Failure to do so will result in a \$100.00 custodial charge.

SUNDAY RENTALS.... if the rental is on a Sunday, a bartender is <u>mandatory</u> to be present for the entire event. The bartender rate will be \$20.00 per hour and invoiced to the member, <u>do not</u> pay the bartender cash.

*REMINDER:* we are a private club, and as such all members are permitted into the club during a private function. Except Sundays



# The Pond

The land of the O.C.N.V.A. is private property and is solely and primarily for the use of members who are in good standing.

## Our pond is spring-fed and stocked by Gehrings Fish Farms, Otterville

By-Laws for the Pond Page 23 of your O.C.N.V.A By-Law book.

No unauthorized person is allowed to use the pond.

Members can fish anytime unless otherwise stated – signs will be posted in the gangway and/or in front of the pond.

When the club rooms are closed, non-members must accompany a club member when fishing. Members are permitted to bring 2 non-members.

## Baiting of the pond is strictly prohibited.

The Navy Club encourages you to take your catch home. Catch and release is causing too many dead fish in the pond. No more than 2 fish per person, per 24 hours. It is illegal to take or attempt to take more than the limit.

It's your club.....your pond....do not abuse it or let anyone else.

# **Cowboy Butter**

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup unsalted butter 1 tbsp dijon mustard 1 tbsp fresh chives, chopped



chopped 1 tbsp fresh parsley, chopped 1 tsp lemon juice 2 tsp fresh thyme, minced 2 tsp garlic, minced 1⁄2 tsp paprika 1⁄4 tsp kosher salt 1/8 peper 1/8 tsp cayenne pepper 1/8 tsp crushed red pepper flakes



In a medium bowl, add the softened butter, dijon mustard, chives, parsley, lemon juice, thyme, garlic, paprika, salt, pepper, cayenne, and red pepper flakes. Mix together until combined. This will make about  $\frac{2}{3}$  cup of butter. (You could also mix the ingredients in a food processor.)

To make a compound butter: Scoop the cowboy butter onto a piece of plastic wrap. Roll the butter into a log shape, pressing and shaping as you go until the butter is completely wrapped in plastic. Twist the ends of the plastic wrap together and refrigerate until firm (2 hours up to overnight).

\*To make a butter dip: Melt the mixture in the microwave in 20-second increments, stirring in between, until fully melted.

Store in the refrigerator in an airtight container for up to 5 days.

#### **Ingredients**

**Butter:** If you use salted butter, you may want to reduce or eliminate the added kosher salt.

**Mustard:** You could also use yellow mustard if that is what you have on hand. It will just slightly alter the flavor.

Fresh Herbs: Both fresh parsley and fresh thyme are added to the butter. If you only



have dried herbs, use about a teaspoon of each (as opposed to a tablespoon of fresh).

**Lemon Juice:** There is just a hint of lemon flavor in the butter. But on any meat, fresh lemon juice is a must!

**Spices:** You will need paprika, salt, pepper, cayenne pepper, and crushed red pepper flakes. The cayenne and red pepper flakes do not add too much heat, but you could leave them out if preferred.


