HMCS Bras d'Or

On 17 October 1940,

HMCS Bras d'Or was ordered to proceed to Clarke City, Quebec, to shadow a Romanian freighter While departing *Bras d'Or* grounded herself on a shoal only minutes outside of port. She managed to free herself and continue on to Clarke City. Both ships encountered poor weather, and as darkness fell both ships turned on their navigation lights, an odd thing for a naval vessel to do during wartime. On the 19th it was reported that the lights of *Bras d'Or* had suddenly vanished.

It is believed that she had sustained unnoticed hull damage when she had run a ground, and that it combined with the poor weather and sea conditions led to her destruction, she sank with all hands.

5 officers and 25 ratings perished.

We must never forget their sacrifice

Note:

HMCS Bras d'Or was not the only vessel to be lost in the St. Lawrence during WW2. Between May 1942 and November 1944 in what historians now refer to as the "Battle of the Gulf of St. Lawrence", a total of 19 merchant ships and 4 naval ships were sunk in the St. Lawrence river and gulf by a few German U-boats. At least 340 people –136 of them aboard the Newfoundland ferry—died as a result of these attacks.








Colour Party

Pumpkin-Pecan Slab Pie

Two of your favorite Thanksgiving pies, combined in one pie and ready for a crowd.

CRUST

1 box (14.1 oz) refrigerated PillsburyTM Pie Crusts (2 Count), softened as directed on box

PUMPKIN PIE FILLING

3/4 cup packed brown sugar 1 can (15 oz) pumpkin (not pumpkin pie mix)

1 1/4 cups half-and-half 2 eggs 1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice



PECAN PIE FILLING

2/3 cup packed brown sugar 1/2 cup light corn syrup 3 eggs 2 cups chopped pecans

Heat oven to 375°F. Remove pie crusts from pouches. On lightly floured surface, unroll and stack crusts one on top of the other. Roll to 17x12-inch rectangle.

Fit crust into ungreased 15x10x1-inch pan, pressing into corners. Fold extra crust even with edges of pan. Crust should come to top edge of pan, sealing any tears in crust.



In large bowl, using whisk, mix Pumpkin Pie Filling ingredients until well blended. Pour filling over crust; spread evenly. Bake 25 to 28 minutes or until filling is set.

bowl, using whisk, mix all Pecan Pie Filling ingredients except pecans until well blended. Stir in pecans. Carefully spoon over pumpkin pie filling, spreading evenly.


