HMCS Charlottetown

September 11, 1942

HMCS Charlottetown was torpedoed and sunk by the German submarine *U-517* in the St. Lawrence River. She had been returning to base when she was struck aft by two torpedoes. She went down fast and though most of her crew got off the ship, some died in the water when her depth charges went off as she sank.

9 crew were killed.

We must never forget their sacrifice.

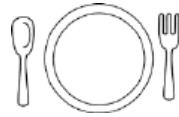

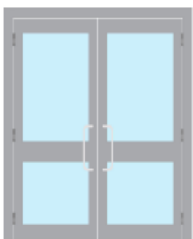

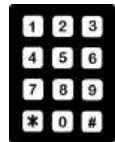

Membership

The summer is coming to an end with the clocks going back and so it is time to look at renewing your OCNVA membership for 2025. The deadline for membership renewal is as always January 31st and after that any members not having paid their dues will no longer be classified as members and will lose access to the club.

On a more positive note, members paying their 2025 membership dues on or before 31 December will have their number entered in a draw with a chance to win a free membership.

The Executive this year has kept the membership dues the same as in 2024 at \$ 85.00 for regular membership and \$ 45.00 for senior membership. A senior is classified as any member having their date of birth on or before 01 February 1960.

Membership cards are now available at the bar and memberships can be paid by cash, debit, credit cards, and e-transfer.

The current membership is now just short of the 950..... cap at 939 members. The breakdown of the membership categories is a follows:-

- 1 - 27 members (Navy)
- 2 - 34 members (Associate)
- 3 - 423 members (Affiliate)
- 4 - 429 members (Social)
- H/L/P - 26 members (Honourary/Life/Professional)

There are still a handful of approved member applications from August and September that have still not picked up their cards and I am also holding 27 applications that will be reviewed at the January Executive meeting once we can confirm our 2025 membership numbers.

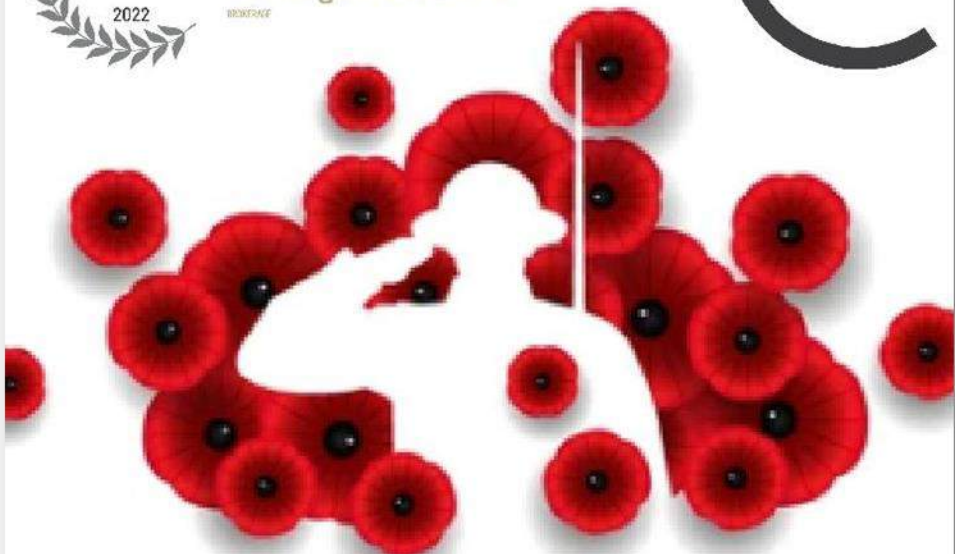

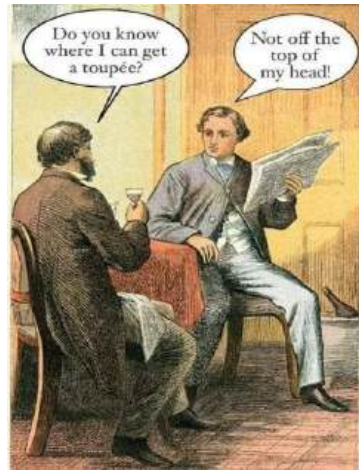

SPINACH DIP BITES

2 cups frozen spinach, thawed
6 oz artichoke hearts
1/2 tsp minced garlic
2 tbsp parmesan cheese

4 oz cream cheese
3/4 cup mozzarella cheese
1/2 tsp garlic salt (with parsley flakes)
pepper to taste
1 can seamless crescent dough

Preheat oven to 375.

In a bowl, combine spinach, artichoke hearts, garlic and Parmesan cheese. Blend in cream cheese and half of your mozzarella cheese. Season with salt and pepper and set aside.

Using a rolling pin, lay out dough on a cutting board and lightly stretch to a 8 x 12 rectangle. Cut dough into 2 inch squares, so you have 24 squares total.

Lightly grease a mini muffin tin and place a square in each slot, gently pushing down to create an indent. (you don't need to mold to the cup.)

Scoop one teaspoon of your spinach mixture on top of each crescent square and gently push in, (bites will mold to your tin while baking). Spread the remaining mozzarella cheese over the tops of each cup.

Bake at 375 for 15 – 17 minutes, until golden brown. Let cool for 5-10 minutes before moving from tray. ENJOY!

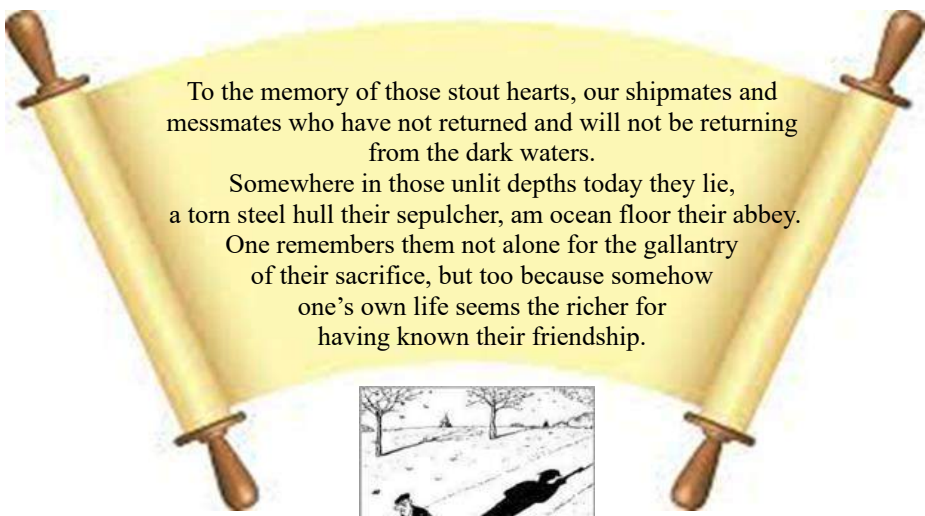

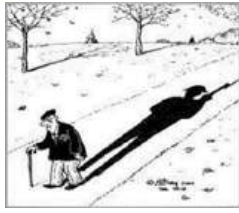
