Should you desire to be reinstated, an application for reinstatement is required and it shall be subject to the same qualification as if he had never been a member.

HMCS Croix



20 Sep 1943

HMCS St. Croix was torpedoed and sunk while escorting a convoy.

68 crew members were lost.

Of the 5 officers and 76 ratings picked up by the British frigate HMS Itchen, only one, Leading Stoker William Allen Fisher, survived the sinking of the Itchen a few days later.

We must never forget their sacrifice

HMCS St. Croix I81 - 18 Dec 1940

A battered HMCS St. Croix enters Halifax Harbour after enduring a powerful North Atlantic storm. This photograph shows some of the damage inflicted on St.

Croix, including guardrails hanging over the ship's side (center) and broken windows on the ship's bridge (top center). Less visible but more serious storm damage included bent steel plating on the bridge and below-deck flooding caused by massive waves. The photograph also emphasizes the ship's narrow hull, which contributed to its instability in heavy seas and to poor handling.

This will be the first report for the 2025 membership year, and I look forward to another busy year for the membership chair. As in previous years, we have held back all the new member applications received in late 2024 and these are being held until the Executive meeting in February 2025. We currently have 43 applications still on hold from 2024. At the end of January 2025, we will know how many new members we can bring on board given our cap of 950 members in the club. Unfortunately, there is no guarantee that all the 2024 membership applicants will be accepted as members until possibly later in the 2025 membership year.

As I clean up the membership list at year end and prepare the new sign-in book ready for the February 2025 General meeting, I would again ask that if you know of any members that are unable to attend a General Meeting through illness, mobility, work schedules, etc. to please let me know so I can mark the book accordingly to maintain their membership status.

In past years, the club has been somewhat lenient on late payment of membership dues but given our high membership numbers, this year, the cut-off date for the payment of 2025 dues is fixed at January 31 2025. After this date, the membership numbers for non-paying delinquent members will have to be reassigned and members will lose their club membership and be subject to the 12-month suspension. Again, I would ask that if you know of any members who cannot pay their membership dues through illness, out of the country, etc., please let the club know and we will work with them to avoid impacting their membership.

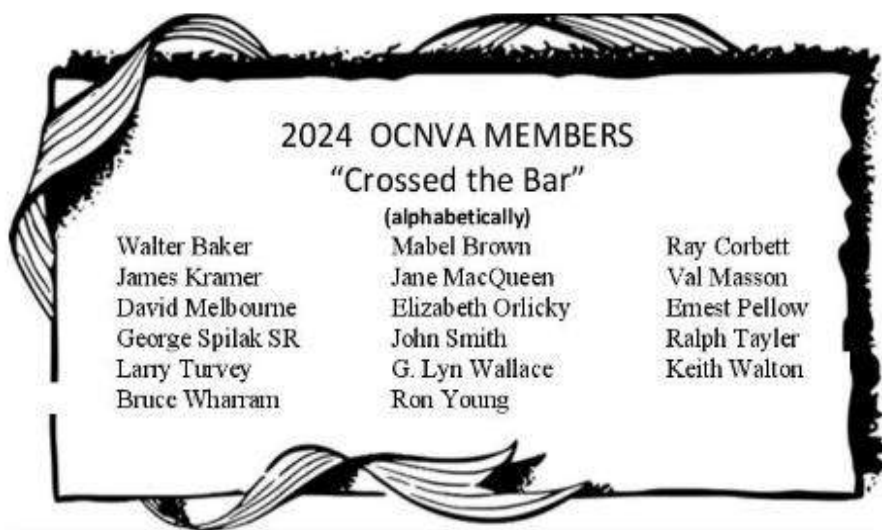

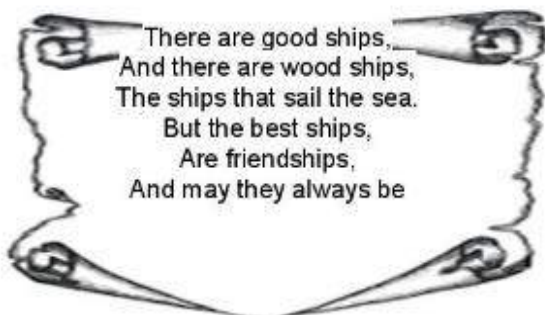
