The most common anti-submarine weapon of World War 2. It is intended to destroy a submarine by being dropped into the water nearby and detonating, subjecting the target to a powerful and destructive hydraulic shock

Hedgehogs

These were a forward-throwing device which cast 24 projectiles into the water ahead of the ship. These only exploded on contact.

Rockets

Small rockets that were fitted to aircraft and used by fighters and bombers to attack-boats.

MK.24 Fido torpedo

Air launched acoustic-searching torpedo that was very successful in hunting U-boats.

As happens every year, we always expect our membership numbers to drop slightly at the end of our membership year in January. As Membership Chair, I was very pleased this year to see the large number of members who have renewed their memberships for 2025, attended a General Meeting, and signed the attendance book. Based on our Clover computer system, the system shows that for the 2025 membership year, our numbers have dropped by 74 members that have decided for whatever reason, not to renew their membership for this year. Our current membership has dropped from 941 down to 867 members and the breakdown of the numbers in each category is shown below.

An accurate membership count at year-end is very important as the Club has to pay an assessment for membership in the RCNA and this is based on our February membership numbers. This is the downside of having the largest Navy Club in Canada as with 850 plus members, the Club will again have to pay out a sizeable assessment this year.

There are currently 72 membership applications on the waiting list, some from November and December of 2024. With our membership cap still at 950 members, we now have room to bring a few new members on board although with only 74 memberships available, we will have to continue with the waiting list process.

I look forward to seeing all the members in the club in 2025.







If approved, you MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE for the ENTIRE EVENT. All guests must leave before or when you do.


You must pay a set donation for the use of the club, payable at the time of booking.

TACO CUPCAKES

- 1 lb ground beef
- 1 packet taco seasoning
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- 24 wonton wrappers
- 1/2 cup sour cream (for topping)
- 1/2 cup salsa (for topping)
- 1/4 cup chopped green onions (for garnish)



Optional Toppings:

- Diced tomatoes - Guacamole - Sliced jalapeños - Sliced black olives

Directions:

- 1. Preheat your oven to 375°F (190°C) and lightly grease a muffin tin.
- 2. In a skillet over medium heat, cook the ground beef until browned. Drain excess fat, add taco seasoning, and cook according to package instructions. Remove from heat.
- 3. Press a wonton wrapper into each muffin cup, then add a layer of seasoned beef, a sprinkle of cheddar, and a layer of Monterey Jack. Add another wonton wrapper on top, then repeat with beef and cheese.
- 4. Bake for 10-12 minutes, until the cheese is melted and the wrappers are golden and crispy.
- 5. Let cool slightly, then top with sour cream, salsa, and green onions. Add any additional toppings as desired.


